Dorante states that two coal hoppers are all that remain of the Powerhouse at **Tennyson** and it won't be long before they are demolished to allow for the construction of the new State **Tennis Centre**.

Dorante says **MIRVAC** are responsible for the construction. Dorante says she visited the site this week to see how nearby residents were coping.

Freeman states that they are demolishing the site currently, which will take another six months. Freeman explains that conceptually the project will comprise of a State **Tennis Centre**, plus apartments on the river.

Freeman details the structure of the **tennis centre**. Freeman states that they have an early works agreement with the State Government to demolish the site. Reardon explains that they are in the later stages of the main building demolition. Rouse says that the recent rain was a godsend as it prevented the dust from the demolition of the power station. Rouse says that the dust had been a big problem, however every time they complain about the issue, those in charge do what they can to minimise the dust. Rouse recalls plans to turn the site into an industrial area, and a film studio. Rouse says that the development allows access to the river frontage.
