Property is the winner

THE State Tennis Centre will be a win for Queensland sport, and for the state's residential development reputation.

Mirvac CEO Development Queensland Chris Freeman said the residential component along the river

would provide "a lifestyle which is without peer in Brisbane".

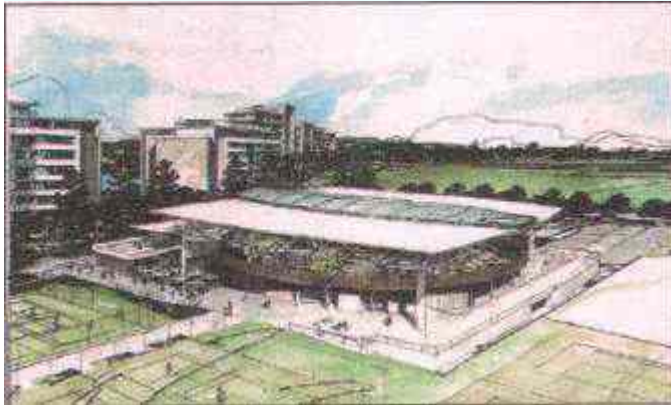
"Residents will also enjoy a range and standard of recreational facilities, both within the project and in the immediate area, which will set this address apart as a place to live," he said.

Mirvac plans 388 apartments within the project and its development will open up a section of the Brisbane River to the public for the first time in decades.

Mr Freeman said the first of the apartments on the riverfront would be

released in June.

More than 400 people have registered their interest in the apartments, which provide access to the tennis courts, gymnasium, a spa, swimming pools and a coffee shop.
