

Buyers snap up next serve of apartments

THE second stage release of Mirvac's Tennyson Reach development has drawn huge interest with more than \$20 million worth of deals struck within the first week.

The \$555 million Tennyson Reach riverfront residential development incorporates the State Government's new State Tennis Centre.

Buyers were quick to snap up the first stage within days.

With the release of 92 apartments in the second stage, Farringford apartments, this week buyers were still keen to secure a slice of the tennis hub.

In all 18 apartments sold for a total of \$22 million.

Mirvac Queensland CEO Chris Freeman said he was happy with the initial sales and predicted that after the public release of the Farringford apartments tomorrow, sales would perform well.

Farringford will be an 11-storey building close to the tennis centre and the plaza area. It features apartments, pavilions and penthouses.

All of the apartments have river views.
