

Highrise outlook up-beat

WORK is on track with Mirvac's Tennyson residential project with the first two buildings now at full height.

The first residents are expected to move in mid-next year.

The residential development sits alongside the Queensland Tennis Centre, in which the centre court was yesterday named Rafter Arena, after Pat Rafter.

That will be handed over to the State Government in December.

Mirvac Queensland CEO Development, Matthew Wallace, said while the major focus had been on the Queensland Tennis Centre, the first stages of Tennyson Reach were also progressing well. Softstone and Lushington apartment buildings are now completed to full height.

undertaken as part of the project are also nearing completion.

Once complete, Tennyson Reach will ultimately comprise 393 luxury apartments across

six buildings. The development is being built on the site of the former Tennyson power station and has already achieved in excess of \$32 million worth of sales.
